We believe the redirection from major conferences that involve high travel costs to locally developed PD opportunities ensures more members have an opportunity for Professional Growth. ANNUAL OECTA AGM

In a few weeks everyone will be driving home in preparation for a well earned rest, or perhaps a frantic few hours packing up the suitcases for a quick trip south to some warmer weather. Whether you are going on a quick vacation or just putting your feet up and enjoying the time off; there will be a small number of us hard at work to start March Break. The Provincial AGM starts Friday night March 13 and continues through the weekend until Monday March 16.

Our delegation will be discussing and voting on the future of our Union, OECTA. There are some hot topics this year. First the fee debate, which is always an issue, continues to be placed in the forefront of our concerns. We have not increased the base rate for many years. All through the years of our 3% increases our base rate stayed the same. OECTA needs to stay financially strong to continue to service our programs, pay for our legal defenses, protect our vocation in the political arena and build our 'war chest' in case of strikes. The impact of provincial bargaining means our reserves can be used up very quickly if the entire province is on strike at the same time.

Second our leadership at the Provincial Executive is up for election from the President on down. Reflected in these election campaigns are some diverse opinions on where we are headed as an Association. There are those who would change the power structure between the Provincial Executive, the Council of Presidents and the AGM.

Third and most important will be the tone of how bargaining should take place now that we sit as a Provincial Team face to face with not only the Boards but the Government. We can't ignore the Province's call for austerity and think we can continue to have public services delivered as they always have been in Ontario. We need to send a strong message to Queen's Park that OECTA is united, is strong and teachers are willingly to stand up for Public Education and all Public Social Services.

We can't ignore the agenda of the government that tries to sell us on a few hundred dollars of tax breaks for families while the corporate business world, like Linamar, are gifted hundreds of thousands of dollars. These corporations are reaping the benefits of our country. They are no longer paying their share to support the services of the very country that supports them.

Finally, we need to reaffirm our strength of will as a Union and as OECTA. The delegation team will be listening, speaking and voting to protect You!

CONTRACT 101 SURPLUS AND REDUNDANCY

These two words can cause everyone stress and anxiety. The terms are very different though and should NEVER be used to describe both situations:

Surplus : The word surplus refers to a site specific situation. A school may find itself losing a classroom teacher. This is what surplus to the site means. In this situation if the school finds itself losing a teacher then the teachers in order of seniority with the Board may chose to declare themselves surplus. If no one declares themselves surplus then in reverse order the lowest person is surplus. **They still have a job and are placed on the unassigned list.**

Redundancy: This is the more frightening of the two words. This word means the teaching position is not available anywhere in the Board. In this case the Board tries to place any permanent teachers in any appropriate year long position that is open such as a temporary re-assignment or leave of absence. In the worst case scenario a teacher would be placed back on the OT roster and have a first right of recall according to their permanent seniority. We have not had teachers declared redundant recently.

OECTA would like to caution all our members to talk to your Rep and seek guidance with the OECTA Office prior to declaring yourself surplus. Surplus teachers are placed after the first two rounds of permanent posting and before the third round of posting. Keep in mind one classroom job lost affects all planning time teachers too.

PROVINICAL BARGAINING EBLAST UPDATE

Our Provincial Bargaining seems to change almost every other week. We have to caution everyone that no one can predict what is going to happen and we are still on the hope for the best, prepare appropriately for the worst. This is why we have asked Job Action Co-Captains be chosen for every site. It is also why we have formed a District Committee.

A week before Council of Presidents (COP) at the start of February we fully expected the call for Strike Votes across the province. Again this is for a Strike Mandate to show our solidarity and a show of strength as we approach real negotiations. THIS is not new from any past year when negotiations are expected to be tough. What is new is that it is a Provincial wide Bargaining Team and not local. When we arrived at COP all was changed as our Team and the Gov't/Board team would not meet on Feb 10/11 and their meetings were pushed back to the 27/28. We were told no Strike Mandates would be held until after March Break and AGM. Now your Presidents have been summoned on Wed March 4 for another Special COP. We will receive our first look at the Gov't/Board offer. Prior to that, we should all have a summary by March 2nd or 3rd.

Once again, as promised, you will be as up to date as we are in the OECTA Office. We expect to be given more direction at the Spec COP about our own timelines, a local Unit Rally and then the Provincial Strike Votes. Wellington called for all Presidents to join other Units at their own Rally's and this was received with support from other Units. Stay Tuned.
