#### President's Message

Last month at the OSSTF AGM a motion was passed that put financial resources towards a policy of the one school system in Ontario. There are many reasons why this should be concerning to all of us. Our jobs (and many teacher jobs in the regular public system) would be placed in jeopardy as some schools with empty classrooms would be merged. Layoffs in the public sector rarely impact the administration. To save the most money it would need to hit our classrooms. This would cause higher class sizes as smaller schools send their students to other schools.

Jobs aside hopefully the very nature of our Catholic System's existence is also something very important to you. As a student of the 70's and 80's Catholics fought hard to keep our schools. Let's not drop the torch today.

# PROVINCIAL OECTA AGM 2016

The Wellington Delegation attended the AGM during the first weekend of March Break. I would like to thank all those who joined the Executive to represent Wellington during our holiday week. Over 640 delegates represented OECTA Units from all across the Province. The AGM is the highest authority of our union and meets every March Break to determine the course our Union, OECTA, is heading in. At the AGM we also elect our Provincial Executive and set our Union Fees for the following year.

The Provincial Executive will remain the same as all positions were acclaimed and the incumbents will return to work with President Ann Hawkins as she will continue in July with her second year of her two year term. This is a tribute to the cooperative spirit evidenced every time we have seen the Provincial Executive working at Council, Workshops and other Labour Conferences.

The Fee Debate once again took centre stage during the AGM. Last year you may recall a motion was put forth to increase the fees to \$100 dollars to reflect the expenditures required at the Provincial level. It was narrowly defeated as the AGM voted instead for a \$50 fee increase. This year the Finance Committee and Treasurer submitted a plan to focus on the Reserve Fund. Our Reserve Fund which is our Strike Fund is the lowest of our Teacher Affiliates. We, OECTA, also pay the lowest in fees compared to OSSTF, ETFO and AEFO. In the face of Provincial Bargaining the Executive and the Council of Presidents believe the Reserve Fund must be built up. There were several motions entered at the AGM to accomplish this and they passed. These resolutions will increase our union dues based on a .13 percentage of your earned wage. Your base fee did not go up.

There were also a variety of guest speakers from the Ontario Federation of Labour, the Canadian Labour Congress, the College of Teachers as well as the Minister of Education Liz Sandals. Stealing the speaker list was Joseph Boyden who spoke about his experiences, knowledge and books on our Aboriginal Peoples. We learned that the incidences of suicides is only surpassed by the incidents of attempts which he explained are at an epidemic level. Hopefully OECTA will be able to assist the promotion of these concerns in an awareness program across the province. Of course there were dozens of other motions and resolutions that were debated, defeated, passed, withdrawn or sent to committee. Included this were motions to change limits to how many Unit/Provincial Executive Positions a member could hold and another motion which would have moved existing budget money from one area to the general fund allowing a balanced budget for next year. With that last motion defeated there will be budget cuts for the Provincial Office next year.

Our delegation continued to participate in all areas of the AGM, gaining the speaker's attention, debating at the mics, discussing issues with other delegates, making provincial contacts and fostering fellowship. We believe Wellington has a far greater impact at Provincial than our ten votes. Though the AGM may seem an attractive fun trip to Toronto it is a series of long sessions in a parliamentary forum with serious issues which affects all our members in Wellington and the Province. Thanks again to not only the delegates but their families who are impacted for these first four days of the March Break!

The call for delegates comes out each year in December. We sponsor additional delegates as Alternates to give more members a chance to see the Provincial AGM at work and learn about OECTA.

### Contract 101: Staffing

This year in the contract several changes have been implemented and more will be announced later in the month. Everyone should be aware that requests are due to the Human Resources Department on March 31st. If you plan to resign, request a personal leave or wish to participate in a cross panel opportunity those forms are due. All your teaching preference forms were also to be returned by March 29th to your supervisor.

According to our staffing booklet letter of understanding there are new opportunities for SERTs to decide to return to a classroom. There are also new preference forms for program teachers to fill out to request a change of duties. We gained clearer language on the number of permanent staff applications for principals to follow when it comes to vacancies before being posted to the LTO list.

In addition, we have a letter of understanding to develop a 'Best Practice' guideline for school staffing procedure and discussions between the administrators and our OECTA staff reps. These talks are ongoing but will be sent to the staff reps later this month.
