SMART FIND AND DATA SUMMARY

The Board released their data results for the Smartfind program at the end of December.

The Joint Staffing committee, consisting of Board, Principals and OECTA, met to examine these results. The data does show that certain members were called more frequently than others when the system went into effect.

We have an agreement with the Board that the data for January will be sent to us so we can monitor the progress smartfind has made at ensuring everyone is being called fairly and those who were missed are slowly getting caught up.

We want to remind all OTs to direct their concerns to Julia and Susan if they are unsure they are being called out properly. They are working hard to implement the program and that you are being called fairly.

How can we help?

*make sure your phone numbers are working at all times

*permanent teachers can call in all pre-arranged bookings as early as possible (60 days)

*You can change your ring on most devices to allow you more time to answer the call.

*be available for as many sites and jobs as possible

We are discussing other changes with call out times to assist OTs in making receiving calls as easy as possible.

Please continue to direct your calls to OECTA as well.

NEW OECTA MEMBERSHIP CARDS

You should have received a letter in the mail. The letter contains a new OECTA membership card with your personal number. The card and number are what you need to participate in the Edvantage program (see your Provincial OECTA website for details).

It also contained important information regarding registering your name and number with Provincial and ensuring they have an up to date personal (home) email address. Once you log in and register you will receive a confirmation email that allows you to participate in a Provincial Collective Bargaining Survey.

The reason it will be done Provincially is we may be headed into Provincial bargaining waters if current legislation before Queens Park is passed.

The other reason it is very important that you have registered your personal email is in case we have emergency votes and/or want to receive notices about meetings. After the last round and the MoU these safe guards were put in place at the 2013 AGM so all members have a chance to vote on contract issues. Yes this could be used for job action votes as well.

Though these are dark topics OECTA wants to ensure we have these lines of communication set up well in advance. Please register, complete the survey and contact Provincial if you did not receive your letter.

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REPORT CARDS AND TECHNOLOGY

On Friday January the 17th during the afternoon our report card system was shut down at every school. The fact that this occurred at all is very troubling. That it occurred on our Elementary PD Day for Reporting handed our Elementary Teachers with lost time during our one chance to work during regular school hours. Though we are grateful the Board responded with an extension from Friday Jan. 24th to Wed. Jan 28th it does not solve the problem. The problem of internet connections and Powerschool began during the week leading up to the 17th. It has continued to some extent here and there since the crash.

OECTA is very concerned it will continue to cause teachers hardship as they try to meet the new deadline. OECTA is equally concerned that our Secondary teachers may face the same or similar problems next week as they scramble to turn Exams into finished report cards. We need to address the reasons behind these issues. We need to be part of the discussion so we are not constantly victims of technology.

What are the solutions?

If the problem is networking and internet connections then the answer seems to be allowing teachers to work where they can use the time most effectively and efficiently. For many members we have been told that is at home. At home not only do we not have to worry about the internet network at the school level we also know the computer we are on will work. For some teachers there is no computer in their classroom that works or they don't have their own classroom. OECTA has been told 'marking at home' can be an issue for the next round of bargaining. OECTA will continue to raise the issue for both Secondary and Elementary teachers in the upcoming months.

LTO and OT Meeting Jan 30

The OT committee arranged two meetings last week for OTs and there is one more on Thursday Jan. 30th at the OECTA Office from 4 to 5. The first purpose is to hand out your new Collective Agreement Booklet. The second is to share the latest news on Smartfind. The third is to continue to offer a time for teachers to meet and discuss issues and have their questions answered.

Each workshop was tailored to either new hires, experienced Occasional or LTO roster teachers. But anyone can attend any of the OT meetings.

Please drop in after school on Thursday for a brief meeting, a few snacks and a chance to share your views with your colleagues and your OECTA Executive Presidents and OTBU President Tim O'Brien.
