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DAILY SHORTAGES

Last week many of you and your colleagues voiced concerns over shortages for daily OTs. On one day we know we ended up with ten uncovered OT assignments. OECTA is very concerned over the continued impact of the Balanced Day and Half Day assignments making it impossible for OTs to cover two schools as there is not enough travel time for an am and pm job. The Board has informed us they are short OTs, more OTs are working on multiple Boards, less OT applications to the roster, and more OTs getting earlier calls from other Boards. None of this solves the problem of you being assigned oncalls with no notice or missing your planning time. Elementary Planning Time must be paid back. We are objecting to oncalls at secondary with no notice. You cannot be assigned more than 3 in a week and 12 in a semester.

MORE THAN JUST AN OFFICE

20TH ANNIVERSARY OF OUR 97 WALK OUT

It was 1997 and every Teacher Union in Ontario walked out! ETFO (FWTAO AND OPSTF), OSSTF, AEFO and OECTA all united in a political protest against sweeping changes to our Public Education system. In an unprecedented Labour protest against the Provincial Ontario Tory Harris Gov't over 100,000 took to the streets in the largest labour protests ever in North America. Our action was deemed illegal and became a court case as we were branded as a Wildcat Strike, however, the Courts deemed our protest fully within our legal rights!

Labour in Canada to this day admires everything teachers did to fight against the Harris government and protected Public Education. Teachers became political and fought hard to raise awareness resulting in an eventual defeat of the Tories and a major recovery in funding for the next 8 years.

Your current salary that places teachers near 100 K is a result of this walk out. Our solidarity which grew during the late 90's brought caps on class sizes, supervision caps, elementary planning time increases, stopped an increase in courses at secondary and ensured decent wages for a decade.

In the 70's teachers ensured the right to collective bargaining and right to strike. In the 90's teachers protected the right to fairness in our Public Education system. The last few years we opposed wage freezes for teachers on the grid and an attempt at a two tiered system. In the future we will be called upon to protect our vocation from cuts and ensure Teachers of the Next Generation enjoy the rights we take for granted.

CONTRACT 101

Sept 1st marked the beginning of a two year extension for our collective agreement.

On Nov 1st as part of that agreement every teacher that was still working AND worked last year should have received a lump sum payment of 0.5 percent. For A 4 Max somewhere around the 470 dollar mark.

If you were on a paid sick leave or paid Mat Leave you should also have received a lump sum payment. We believe most OTs from last year were paid sometime during the third week of October while Permanent teachers received their lump sum the last week of October.

We believe some transitional contract teachers were missed as they moved from OT to Permanent status. Please email John Kamassah if you have questions and feel free to cc Mark for help.

Locally we participate in actions of Social Justice through two main organizations. First, as a member of the Ontario Federation of Labour and the Canadian Labour Congress, OECTA Provincial encourages local Units to get involved with their local District Labour Council. We joined shortly after the fall of 2013 and have been a solid contributor ever since. OECTA has spear-headed the corn roast each year at the Guelph and District Labour Council Labour Day Picnic. We have been the main provider for the soup at their annual Christmas Soup and Socks Program each December. Last year we were the chair for the return of the GDLC to the Guelph Santa Claus Parade.

These events and participation are very important in making sure our Catholic Teacher profile remains high in the eyes of our other brother and sister unions. We are under attack for the first time in a long time seriously by political forces that wish to end Publicly Funded Catholic Education in Ontario. We will need the support of other unions to rally behind our union and our system in order to survive. Making sure we are a Labour partner at the table is not only the right thing to do it is required for self preservation!

With that in mind we need volunteers to form a 'flying squad' of members who can be called to show up for an hour to walk picket lines or attend rallies.
