Collective Bargaining Update

The preparations for the next round of bargaining is well underway and the process will kick into high gear in January.

1. CB Updates

Starting in January, all updates with regards to collective bargaining will be distributed in a separate publication, using a combination of hard copy and electronic formats. Hard copies will use golden rod colour paper to distinguish it from other OECTA publications. Greater detail on some of the items included here will be published in these regular updates.

2. CB regional Workshops Attended; Meetings held

Many members from the unit attended provincial regional workshops held in November as part of the preparation for the next round of collective bargaining. Provincial staff have visited the unit and met with unit officers. Other provincial meetings, related to collective bargaining, have also been attended by unit officers.

3. Collective Bargaining Committee Selected

The Unit's Bargaining Committee has been established, representing a balance of experience; elementary, secondary and occasional teachers; and executive and non executive members..

4. CB Workgroups Established

As part of the process to encourage a broader participation in the development of the Unit proposal for bargaining, the unit has established 7 workgroups which will be meeting starting in January. Each workgroup will focus on one area with a view to providing advice for further member input (e.g. survey), priority for local bargaining and possible proposed contract changes or new language. The 7 workgroups are: Secondary Workload, Elementary Workload, Occasional Teachers, Special Education, Health and Safety, FSL/Planning Time Teachers (Elementary.), and System.

OECTA'S leadership TRAINING PROGRAM 2011-2012

Foundational Leadership Training Program
Application deadline: January 13, 2012

OECTA *e-agenda* for Mon, Dec.19, 2011.

Online applications are now being taken for OECTA's 2011-12 Leadership Training Program at www.oecta.on.ca. The deadline to apply is January 13, 2012.

The program reflects OECTA's commitment to training strong teacher activists to develop a broad sense of advocacy, as well as specific knowledge and skills to provide service and leadership at the local and provincial level.

Participants will gain knowledge and skills in collective bargaining, communication, contract

administration, leadership, legislative framework, OECTA governance, and professional relations. A Certificate of Foundational Training will be awarded following completion of six required three-hour modules and two optional three-hour modules. Four training days will be held March 29 – 30, 2012 and May 24-25, 2012, at the Hilton Suites, Markham.

OECTA will cover release time, travel, accommodation, and program costs for participants selected to attend the four days of training.

To be considered as a candidate for the Leadership Training Program, participants must commit to serving members of their local unit in some capacity. Selection of applicants will be a joint process by the local unit executive and Provincial Office.

Government Proposing Tougher Anti-Bullying Legislation

The McGuinty government has introduced new legislation, the *Accepting Schools Act*, which, if passed, is intended to help make Ontario schools safer and more accepting places to learn including:

Tougher consequences for bullying and hate-motivated actions -- up to, and including, expulsion

Requiring all schools to support any students who want to lead activities that promote understanding, acceptance and respect for all.

Requiring school boards to develop policies and guidelines that include greater supports for students.

OECTA Response to New Anti-Bullying Law — excerpted from a press release Dec.1, 2011

The Ontario English Catholic Teachers' Association (OECTA) supports the Government's new Accepting Schools Act and Comprehensive Action Plan and recognizes its implementation as critical to students' well being in Ontario schools.

"It is not enough to tell our students it will get better when they leave school," says OECTA President Kevin O'Dwyer. "The hallways, cafeterias and classrooms in all our schools must be safe and welcoming places for children today."

Since well before OECTA was incorporated in 1944, social justice, compassion and respect for all have defined Catholic education in Ontario.

"Our members are committed to creating emotionally and physically safe spaces for all students who arrive in our classrooms," adds O'Dwyer. "Championing human rights, social justice, equity and inclusion in our schools and communities speaks to who we are as Catholics and educators."

Advice on the Use of Email and Other Electronic Communication

As per the recent Advisory from the Ontario College of Teachers, teachers need to exercise caution in the use of social networking (e.g. Facebook), email contact with parents and students and the use of homework boards etc.

OECTA's pamphlet on "Appropriate and Professional Use of Electronic Communications" is available on the provincial and local websites, and re-inforces the message of caution

In particular, OECTA strongly advises limiting email contact with parents and to avoid using email to communicate with students.

As well, locally, 2011 the Board recently approved a revised policy on the Appropriate Use of Information Technologies. It is extremely important for members to be aware that the network is monitored by software which can detect and "flag" unusual activity e.g. inappropriate websites, use of bit torrents, excessive use of bandwidth. Again, extreme caution is advised when using the Board's hardware and resources.

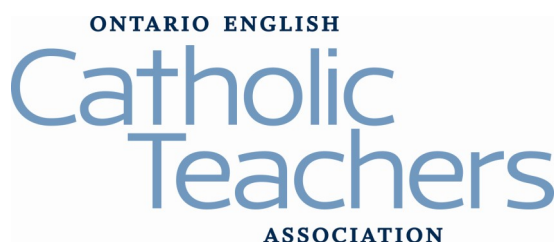

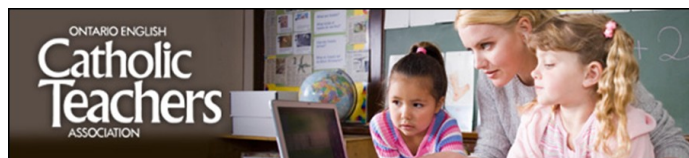
